 - Estonia ranks fifth in Reading, fourth in Science and eighth in Mathematics among all participating countries and economies.
- Education: entrepreneurship, digital competences& financial literacy are in focus at all educational levels.



















Facts & Figures

- Oldest private business school in the Baltics, founded in 1988
- Strong corporate relations with business community
- Offers bachelor's, master's, and doctoral-level programmes in the business and administration study programme group
- First university in Estonia to establish a subsidiary in Finland in 2011.
- Partnerships with 60 universities in 30 countries
- 1400 students, over 4700 alumni
- Average admission of students per year:

 - EBS researchers analyzed financial literacy levels among Estonian students and adults, mapped the financial education resources available, and provided policy recommendations for increasing financial well-being in Estonia
 - Their findings are also published in the book "Financial education: Current practices and future challenges" De Witte, Kristof; Holz, Oliver; De Beckker, Kenneth(2020) Chapter 4. Financial education in Estonia
- Sustainability and Financial issues are also addressed by experts/faculty (including International faculty) in Bachelor, Master, MBA and doctoral studies level.
